Dear Parents/Guardians,

As part of our Year 4 History curriculum, we are excited to offer the children the opportunity to visit **Murton Park in York on Thursday 5th November**. This visit will enhance our learning about the Anglo-Saxons by immersing the children in a realistic Anglo-Saxon settlement, allowing them to experience what life may have been like during this fascinating period of history. Children will even have the opportunity to dress up as Anglo-Saxons and take part in a range of hands-on activities.

The **cost** of the trip is **£32.00 per child**, which covers both the coach travel and the educational experience at Murton Park. Payment and consent to be given via the Arbor trips section.

Travel Arrangements

We will be travelling as a whole year group by coach to and from Murton Park.

As we will be setting off before the school day begins, all children must **arrive** at school at **8:00am promptly**. We expect to return to school between **4:30pm and 5:00pm**, depending on traffic conditions. We will provide an estimated time of arrival (ETA) when we leave Murton Park and will keep families updated throughout the journey via Arbor.

What Should Children Wear?

Children should come to school wearing:

- Full school uniform
- A suitable warm and waterproof coat or raincoat, as some activities may take place outdoors, even in wet weather
- Comfortable and appropriate footwear, such as trainers, as children will be on their feet for most of the day

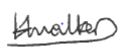
Lunch Arrangements
