Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of our cross-curricular learning this term, we are excited to announce that Year 3 will be visiting Magna Science Adventure Centre in Rotherham on Thursday 12th February. This visit will deepen the children's understanding of volcanoes and support our work across Science, Geography, and English, linked to our theme "What makes the Earth rumble?"

During the trip, the children will:

- Take part in a specialist Volcanoes Workshop, exploring how volcanoes form, what causes eruptions, and their impact on the world.
- Investigate how volcanoes lay down rock layers and identify common rocks.
- Enjoy a hands-on activity making their own volcanoes.
- Explore the museum's interactive zones to bring their learning to life.

Key Information:

Date: Thursday 12th February 2026

Times: Leave school at 8:45am and return around 4:00pm (slightly later than usual – we will keep parents updated if the arrival time back at school changes).

Clothing: Full school uniform, suitable footwear, and a warm coat, gloves, and hat as the building is in an old steel works and can be cold.

Lunch: Please provide a packed lunch and plenty of water. Children entitled to free school meals can have a packed lunch ordered from school.

We would be grateful if you could contribute £20.51 towards the cost of the booking. The cost of the visit is calculated by dividing the total amount by the number of children in the class/year group. Any outstanding money resulting from non-payments is paid for by school. However, as the school has limited funds to fall back on, we rely on the good will of parents/carers to ensure that the visit can take place. Otherwise under some circumstances it may be necessary to cancel the visit.

Payments must be made and permissions given on Parent Pay, please note all payments are non-refundable.
