English


The children will be reading **The Twits**, exploring this funny and imaginative story in depth, answering a variety of comprehension questions that focus on **retrieval** and **inference**, particularly around the main characters, Mr. and Mrs. Twit.

In writing, the children will be developing their skills through **incidental character descriptions** and by **rewriting a section of the story** in their own words. Our key grammar and writing focuses this term will include:

- Using **expanded noun phrases** to add detail and description
- Including **adverbial phrases** to vary sentence openings and add interest
- **Introducing dialogue** to show character and move the story forward

Key text this half term

The children will read **The Twits by Roald Dahl**



Maths



The children will:

- add and subtract numbers with up to 3 digits, using formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction
- estimate the answer to a calculation and use inverse operations to check answers
- recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables
- write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that they know, including for two-digit numbers times one-digit numbers, using mental and progressing to formal written methods
- solve problems, including missing number problems, involving multiplication and division

Science

Rocks, Fossils and Soils

As Scientists, we will be learning about different types of rocks, and their properties. We will explore how fossils are made and understand that soil is made from rocks and organic matter. Through experiments, we will test properties like hardness and permeability, gaining a deeper understanding of the natural processes that shape our Earth.

The Wider Curriculum



Geography – Where is Bradford and what is it like to live there? The children will locate Bradford on a map, identify its human and physical features, and take part in a visit to explore the city first-hand. They will then compare Bradford to other localities, developing their understanding of place and geographical vocabulary.

D.T – Year 3 will be developing their design and sewing skills by creating their own foraging bags, learning how to plan, join, and evaluate with care and creativity.

Computing – Children will use a range of techniques to create a stop-frame animation using tablets. Next, they will apply those skills to create a story-based animation.

R.E – Pupils will learn about the concept of leadership. It will be an introduction to Jesus, The Prophet Muhammad and Moses as important leaders for Christians, Muslims and Jews.

French - In French this half term, we will continue developing our speaking and listening skills through short conversations, including asking and answering questions such as “How old are you?”. The children will also learn about French Christmas traditions, comparing them to celebrations in the UK. This will help build both their language confidence and cultural understanding.

P.E – Children will develop skills in a range of multi-sports including Football, Netball and Dodgeball.



PSHE - SCARF Including Online Safety

This term in PSHE, children will learn about **Valuing Difference**, focusing on respecting others, understanding friendships and communities, and celebrating what makes each person unique.

In E-Safety, children will learn about **Online Relationships**, focusing on how to communicate safely, build positive connections, and protect their personal information online.
